While the evidence of climate change is overwhelming, climate action is facing a backlash. This could, in part, be attributed to its failure to connect with the aspirations, but also the difficulties, of people all over the world. Young people are not exempt, in spite of surveys telling us that their choices and actions are already largely influenced by climate issues.

This project is about listening to them; to better understand how young people in the world see the future in the context of climate change, and of the different (political, economic, cultural, social...) ways of responding to it.

To do this, we are seeking out, documenting and interacting with past, ongoing or upcoming initiatives in which youths take, or are given, time to articulate, formulate and question their experiences and interrogations regarding climate change, the responses to it, and the futures that result from them. We wish to elevate the visibility of these initiatives and their outcomes; to create interactions among them; and to gain insights based on their combined findings.

In order to explore a wide plurality of visions, we are looking for collective, artistic, fictional and/or foresight processes, happening on the ground, in as many places in the world as possible.
